### More about Neil Oliver, our latest Business Advertiser:

**I first became interested in podiatry** whilst I was on a tiny island in New Zealand, which contained just a convenience shop, fish & chip shop, Doctor's surgery & Podiatrist/ Chiropodist clinic. At the time I was looking for a career change from IT and this made me realise there is a high demand for chiropodiatists/ podiatrists. I returned to Plymouth and started the 3 year degree course at University, managing to pass with a First.

I do not have premises so **I spend my days travelling** between patient's homes, Age Concern Groups and Residential Homes. I find the job fulfilling and there is plenty of job satisfaction when patients express comments like **"having new feet"** or **"pain-free feet"**. I also enjoy speaking with my patients, many of whom are in their 70s, 80s or 90s, and hearing their viewpoints and experiences. **My only dislike of the job is the rising petrol prices!**

## Autumn in the South Hill Garden

**This year has gone very quickly and autumn is once more upon us.**

The days are getting shorter and the weather a little chilly. **It's time to plant** winter pansies, violas, forget-me-nots, wallflowers, and polyanthus, and of course, all the lovely spring bulbs for next spring. Don't forget to water and feed the plants when you have put them in.

**Herbaceous borders** need redoing every three or four years, by lifting plants that have got too large and splitting them, and replanting. Fork some **well**

**rotted farmyard manure** into the border around the plants you haven't moved. They will do so much better next year. I always try to leave some seed heads on for the birds, it may look untidy for a while, but it keeps the birds happy and you can always cut the plants down later. **Roses can be increased by cuttings** taken now, I put the cuttings in a row on a bit of the vegetable patch and then leave them till they have rooted. Cuttings should be of well ripened wood of one season's growth, cut just below the growing point take the bottom few leaves off and insert in the soil. I don't usually bother with rooting hormone powder, but you can use it if you prefer.



**There is still time to plant trees and shrubs;** the soil is still warm so they should do quite well. It is also the time to **lift dahlias and tuberous begonias** and store them over winter. It's best to reduce the height of roses and buddleias, otherwise the strong winter winds will cause them to rock and do damage, but do the main pruning in the spring.

**The greenhouse** needs to be cleaned, clear out the tomato plants etc., when they have finished fruiting. Tender plants should be taken into the greenhouse as soon as it has been cleaned. You could also sow sweet peas now in the greenhouse for next spring.

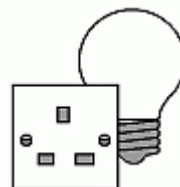

## Local Girl Goes Far!

As many of you are aware, a little while ago I spent 2 weeks working in **Kruger National Park, South Africa**. Many of you lovely people kindly bought raffle tickets from me, to make the trip possible - so I thought it only right to tell you what your money actually helped do.

As I am sure many of you know, some time ago in Africa **elephant numbers** were in sharp decline - due to mass poaching and culling. But since the ban on culling in 1995 the elephant population has doubled to more than 18000 which sounds great! However, the problem is that elephants enjoy destroying things and due to their sheer size these "things" are usually trees! To give you some kind of scale, Kruger Park is about the size of Wales, huge I know. Now imagine there are 18000 elephants rampaging around Wales and we see the problem.



The work I was helping out with is being done by **Operation Wallacea (OpWall)** and I was in Nsikazi camp in the South west end of Kruger. Wallacea have been in Nsikazi for about 2 years and they are using the help of volunteers like me to conduct their **bird counts and habitat surveys**. This involved me and my group leaving early in the morning and, for the bird counts, going to a set location and identifying every bird we heard or saw for 20 minutes, then moving on to another location. With the habitat surveys, we were given a map and around eight areas of 25 square metres in which to identify every plant and decide the level of elephant damage on

each plant.

**To prepare** for the bird counts and habitat surveys we spent the first week going on walks and drives in the bush surrounding our camp, to learn to identify our trees and game/animals. We also had a series of lectures on the elephant problem we were helping to investigate. As well as this we had debates with other groups in the camp which was really interesting to find out the opinions on the problem from people all around the world.



During my stay I had the chance to see all sorts of animals close up – Including **lions, giraffes, buffalo and zebra**. There was also a **black widow spider** in the loo cubicle and a **leopard** next to my tent.....but I won't dwell on that!

**I am hoping to return to South Africa** next year as I have got a job with OpWall as their representative in Aberystwyth (my university town) and they will fund my next trip. So hopefully I won't be hassling my neighbours again for cash but I am not making any promises. So thank you again everybody for helping to make my trip possible. I expect it'll be the first of many, but one I will never, ever forget.



## Parish Council Bulletin

### Remember this?

**After all the disruption caused by the snow** at the beginning of the year, the Parish Council asked Cornwall Council if it would be possible to have a salt bin in the parish. Initially they said we could have one.

**However** recently they have changed their policy. **As a cost saving measure**, Cornwall Council is no longer going to maintain salt bins anywhere in the County. Your Parish Council did consider providing a bin from it's own funds. Where would it be sited and how could we ensure that the salt was used sensibly and fairly?



**The fairest solution** is for those of us who might need salt in the winter so get our own supply. Most of the agricultural and builder's merchants sell it.

Cornwall Council, through Cormac, will still be applying salt to keep the main roads clear of ice as before.

## From our Cornwall Council Representative

**August 2010** - News this month has been dominated by the announcement that **government cuts** in grants to local authorities will inevitably lead to a reduction in the service which Cornwall Council can provide and it has been forecast that some 2000 jobs will be lost. Decisions about where cuts will be made have yet to be considered but such drastic reductions will not only affect us all but are bound to be detrimental to the economy of Cornwall. My own view is that as a Council we need to look at all options for overall cost reduction and ways of managing the cuts before cutting out services. Time will tell but I am always happy to represent community views when the debate on the way forward is held.

**The Local Enterprise Partnership programme** (which includes Plymouth, Devon and Torbay) was welcomed by the Prime Minister on a recent visit as an exemplar for investment and regeneration in the South West.

**Questions were asked in Council** about the impact of **Academy status** on school services in the County. At present it would seem that there is no cause for anxiety given that the local authority only funds about 25% of the school budgets and non academy schools should not be affected.

**Members voted unanimously** not to accept the 2.3% increase in allowances as suggested by the Local Government Association. In these uncertain times it was clearly the right thing to do. It is however a thorny issue given that young people are unable to give the considerable amount of time required to undertake the duties required of Councillors and also be able to undertake full time work to allow them to enter the housing market.

After all the scare stories I can advise that **Broadband is coming to Cornwall**. It will be rolled out, probably starting in the East and give speeds of 100k rather than the 8k we have now. This should be of comfort especially to our business and science based communities.

**Green bags are now available for glass recycling** at the kerbside. You can carry on using plastic bags but the alternatives are available at the One Stop Shops in Liskeard and Callington

**Finally** I would like to congratulate Danny McGeean on his success in challenging the appeal decision in respect of the wind turbine in Pensilva. He showed great courage and determination and I take my hat off to him.
